My name is Josh Levine and I am a senior in the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University. I am excited to have an opportunity to conduct research with student-athletes in hopes of benefiting their high school experience.

Your son or daughter is invited to participate in a study entitled, *Pluralistic ignorance in student-athlete's perceptions of academic achievement*, which explores the relationship between student's perceptions of athletic and academic achievement.

This study has been approved by Princeton University's Institutional Review Board. In the first part of this study, your child will be asked to fill out a worksheet as part of an experiment. Pre-GPA information will be collected but will be anonymous. Your child will be asked to fill out a survey at the end of this study asking them questions regarding their perceptions of academic and athletic achievement. Demographic questions include age, race, gender, and grade. GPA data will be collected again anonymously at the end of the study.

Participation in this study is non-binding, meaning that at any time in the study your child may quit. There are no risks present in this study beyond those of everyday life. As researchers, our goal is to find ways to help improve the academic achievement of your child and we hope the results from this study will guide us toward education policies that will achieve those goals.
