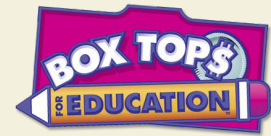


GTACS Labels Program: Turning your TRASH into CASH!

Simply cut out the little squares of cardboard or paper on the empty packages before you throw them out, and bring them to school!

LABELS FOR EDUCATION (CAMPBELL'S UPC CODES AND V-8 LIDS):

Each of these has a point value. Our principals use the accumulated points to obtain free educational equipment for our schools, such as computer software, microscopes, and playground equipment. Labels for Education UPC codes can be found on all Campbell's soup cans, Pepperidge Farm Products (including Goldfish crackers), and Prego spaghetti sauces.
