<p>Western Michigan University Medallion Scholarship</p>	<p>Students must have application fee, test scores AND transcript in by 12/4/2009 to the WMU office of admissions</p>	<p>High School seniors entering WMU for the 1st time in fall of 2010 as a degree-seeking students have the opportunity to apply. Students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.7 or higher, on a 4.0 scale, at the end of their junior year AND have an ACT composite score of 26 or higher or an SAT math + critical reading score of 1170 or higher. To qualify, you must be in high school or college without a bachelor's degree and be a child, grandchild, or great-grandchild of a war-time veteran who is planning on attending an accredited college or university. Selections is based on the student's GPA of 2.5 or higher, financial need, parent's or grandparent's honorable active war-time military service, goals and intentions.</p>

Michigan Student Athlete of the Year	31-Jan-09	In order to qualify for this scholarship, you must be a member of the senior class, demonstrate excellence in athletics (MHSAA sanctioned sports & state ranking), demonstrate excellence in scholastics (GPA of 3.0 or higher and ACT/SAT score are reviewed), recognize citizenship (school leadership, community involvement, volunteerism).
Burger King Scholars	1-Feb-10	In order to apply for this scholarship, you must work part-time (a minimum of 10 hours per week...and this does NOT have to be at Burger King), have a minimum 2.5 GPA, are actively involved in community service activities and can demonstrate financial need. Students applying must have a minimum 3.0 GPA for 10th and 11th grades and have a minimum composite of 26 on the ACT exam. Applicants must submit a list of senior classes, attach a transcript with included ACT test scores and complete an application. ONLY ONE application is necessary for all scholarships available. <p>Michigan State University Alumni Association</p>	<p>26-Feb-10</p>	<p>Five \$1,500 scholarships are available for students who plan to attend MSU for the 2010-2011 academic year. Students who apply must be accepted for MSU admission. Criteria for selection includes: grade point average, test scores, positive recommendations from teachers and/or counselor, and the applicants' written comments on the application. Grade point average should be 3.5 or higher ALTHOUGH consideration may be given to students with slightly lower averages.</p>
<p>The Grand Traverse Area Retired School Personnel Academic Scholarship</p>	<p>26-Feb-10</p>	<p>A student should have a minimum GPA of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, must have a composite of 1100 on the SAT or an ACT composite of 27, must be planning to attend a college or university with the goal of earning a baccalaureate degree, should be involved in high school activities and/or outside activities such as employment or community service. Students who wish to apply for this scholarship MUST submit three GTARSP recommendation forms; one from a counselor, one from a faculty member and one from a personal reference (not a family member). Applications and recommendation forms are located in the guidance office.</p>

<p>The Grand Traverse Area Retired School Personnel Vocational Scholarship</p>	<p>26-Feb-10</p>	<p>A student should present an overall GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. A student may apply if he or she is planning to enroll in a non-baccalaureate degree program and has a specific vocational goal. A student must submit three completed GTARSP recommendation forms: one from a counselor, one from another faculty member and one from a personal reference (not a family member). A student must provide some evidence of his or her specific achievement within the chosen field.</p>
<p>Munson Health Careers Scholarship</p>	<p>3/6/2010 UPDATED!!!!</p>	<p>Students who wish to apply for this scholarship should be a resident of Grand Traverse, Wexford or Antrim counties for a period of at least 6 months prior to application. You must be pursuing a health-related program of study in an accredited college or university. You must provide a recent transcript verifying a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. ESSAYS hold a lot of weight so have someone review your answers before sending them into the committee. Good luck.</p>
<p>American Legion Eagle Scout of the Year</p>	<p>1-Mar-10</p>	<p>Eligible students must be registered members of a Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Scout Team, or Venturing Crew chartered to an American Legion Post, American Legion Auxiliary Unit or Sons of the American Legion squadron -OR- be a registered, active member of a chartered Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Scout Team, or Venturing Crew, and the son or grandson of a Legionnaire or Auxiliary member -AND- received the Eagle Scout Award, be an active member of his religious institution and must have received the appropriate Boy Scout Religious emblem, have demonstrated practical citizenship in church, school, scouting, and community, and be at least 15 years old at the time of selection.</p>

<p>Eastern Michigan University Alumni Association Scholarship</p>	<p>5-Mar-10</p>	<p>The award granted for this scholarship is \$1,250 per academic year and may be renewed for four consecutive years for a maximum of \$5,000.
