If you have not turned in your course selection sheet yet, PLEASE get these to the office next week or you will not be scheduled in classes for next year.

**DUAL Enrollment classes:** If you plan/hope to take classes at CENTRAL, NMC or CTC next year there are steps to take. REMEMBER, you can only take classes that are NOT offered at SF.

Central High School Registration forms are available in the main office. These **must be completed and turned back into the office by April 23<sup>rd</sup>** so we can provide the

information to Central. Once registration forms have been completed, you will be scheduled for an orientation date to “pick” the hour/time you want the class. REMEMBER this class has to fit into our schedule. Central’s orientation is usually held in July. Keep an eye on their website: [tcaps.net/csh](http://tcaps.net/csh) regarding dates/time for orientation. You are responsible for making sure you attend the orientation or you will not be signed up for class.

CTC enrollment forms were distributed today. If you are a rising 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grader who plans to attend classes at CTC next year, you must complete the enrollment form and **return this to the SF guidance office by April 23<sup>rd</sup>**. CTC needs this information before you can be officially enrolled.

The fall schedule for NMC classes is now available on their website at [nmc.edu](http://nmc.edu). Please take a look at the classes that interest you and stop by the guidance office to pick up the necessary paperwork. Remember, these classes MUST fit into our schedule, so you may need more than one option. Also keep an eye on the prerequisites! You will only be able to take entry level classes unless you have passed and earned AP credits. Remember in the past TCAPS has paid for the class if you are concurrently enrolled in classes taught by TCAPS teachers, so make sure your schedule for next year reflects this. If you are not sure which classes are taught by TCAPS teachers, see me! ☺ (We are also assuming TCAPS will once again pay for these classes, but I have not had the official word on this for next year.)

Please consider the following:

- 171 families with a total of 336 students received some level of tuition assistance during the current school year. This means 1 out of every 3 students are positively impacted.

- To determine eligibility, families requesting tuition assistance must formally apply to an outside screening company called Private School Aid Service. Scholarship amounts vary greatly among families and are based on several objective factors.
- Approximately 80% of applicants have an adjusted available income of less than \$50,000.

### **K of C Announces Novena for Pope Benedict XVI**

On Oct. 2, 1881, a group of men met in the basement of St. Mary's Church on Hillhouse Avenue in New Haven, Connecticut. Called together by their 29-year-old parish priest,

Father Michael J. McGivney, these men formed a fraternal society that would one day become the world's largest Catholic family fraternal service organization. Seeking strength in solidarity, and security through unity of purpose and devotion to a holy cause, they vowed to be defenders of their country, their families and their faith. Bound together by the ideal of Christopher Columbus, the discoverer of the Americas, the one whose hand brought Christianity to the New World, they named themselves the Knights of Columbus. Nearly 130 years later, the Order is still true to its founding principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Knights of Columbus often referred to as "the strong right arm of the Church," proudly professes their unwavering solidarity with our priests, our bishops and our pope.

In a special initiative announced by Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson on March 31, the Knights of Columbus are calling on its members and all Catholics to join in a novena for Pope Benedict XVI "to manifest our prayerful solidarity with our Holy Father at this time of unprecedented challenge." The Most Rev. Bernard A. The GTACS “Scholarship Fund” is critical to the health and vitality of our school system. The diversity of our classrooms, the intensity of our faith experiences, the depth of our athletic teams, and the vibrancy of our arts programs are all dependent upon the GTACS “Scholarship Fund.” Tuition scholarships allow all qualified students an opportunity to achieve their spiritual and academic potential. Please consider the following:

- 171 families with a total of 336 students received some level of tuition assistance during the current school year. This means 1 out of every 3 students are positively impacted.

- To determine eligibility, families requesting tuition assistance must formally apply to an outside screening company called Private School Aid Service. Scholarship amounts vary greatly among families and are based on several objective factors.
- Approximately 80% of applicants have an adjusted available income of less than \$50,000.

### **K of C Announces Novena for Pope Benedict XVI**

On Oct. 2, 1881, a group of men met in the basement of St. Mary's Church on Hillhouse Avenue in New Haven, Connecticut. Called together by their 29-year-old parish priest,

Father Michael J. McGivney, these men formed a fraternal society that would one day become the world's largest Catholic family fraternal service organization. Seeking strength in solidarity, and security through unity of purpose and devotion to a holy cause, they vowed to be defenders of their country, their families and their faith. Bound together by the ideal of Christopher Columbus, the discoverer of the Americas, the one whose hand brought Christianity to the New World, they named themselves the Knights of Columbus. Nearly 130 years later, the Order is still true to its founding principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Knights of Columbus often referred to as "the strong right arm of the Church," proudly professes their unwavering solidarity with our priests, our bishops and our pope.

In a special initiative announced by Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson on March 31, the Knights of Columbus are calling on its members and all Catholics to join in a novena for Pope Benedict XVI "to manifest our prayerful solidarity with our Holy Father at this time of unprecedented challenge." The Most Rev. Bernard A. Hebda, Bishop of the Diocese of Gaylord, has joined the Knights of Columbus in encouraging the faithful to continually support the Holy Father, as well as our clergy and religious through their prayers.
